Li-chiang Chu Scholarships

The Scholarship's Purpose

- ❖ Li-chiang Chu Scholarships provide financial support to non-U.S or non-Canadian students who are graduates of Woodstock School and have successfully completed at least one semester or one quarter of studies in North America at an accredited educational institution.
- ❖ These Scholarships are designed to supplement rather than replace work effort and extended family resources if financial resources have become insufficient to cover their tuition, fees, and living expenses.
- ❖ Li Chu wanted the Scholarships' recipients to be known for an attitude of service to others and who are likely to extend aid to future students who may encounter a similar financial need in completing their studies in North America.

Limitation

No employee, director, trustee, committee member or other individual with a formal role in the governing structure of Friends of Woodstock School (FWS), or any family member of such individuals, shall be eligible to receive a scholarship.

Eligibility

- To be eligible to receive a Li-chiang Chu Scholarship, an individual must:
 - 1. Have graduated from Woodstock School, and
 - 2. Be able to document citizenship in a nation other than the United States or Canada, or recognition of stateless status by a national or international entity, and
 - 3. Provide proof of a valid student visa or study permit from the U.S. or Canada, and
 - 4. Have completed one semester or quarter of studies in an accredited U.S. or Canadian university or college and intend or hope to continue studies at such an institution. This includes accredited graduate and vocational schools, providing the school or the course or intended studies are not specific to dance or art and they meet the definitions of an educational institution.
 - 5. Have earned an average grade of no lower than 3.0 on a four-point scale in his or her post-high school studies, and
 - 6. Be able to justify the need for financial assistance to continue his or her studies.
 - 7. Be able to provide letters of recommendation from non-family members, preferably a professor/administrator of the student's North American accredited educational institution.

Selection Criteria

- ❖ The following factors shall be taken into account:
 - 1. Academic ability and achievement.
 - 2. A demonstrable record of leadership potential evidenced by past service involvement, relevant activities in scholastics, and extra-curricular activities or volunteer work.
 - 3. Good character along with evidence of determination, intellectual curiosity, and personal integrity.
 - 4. Stated intention or implied likelihood that the recipient will give assistance to future Woodstock School graduates who have a similar financial need while pursuing studies in North America.

Preferences

- In selecting potential recipients of comparable suitability:
 - 1. Preference shall be given to students who are children of long-serving staff at Woodstock School, defined as staff members who have served at the School for 10 years or more.
 - 2. Secondary preference shall be given to students wishing to continue their under-graduate education.
